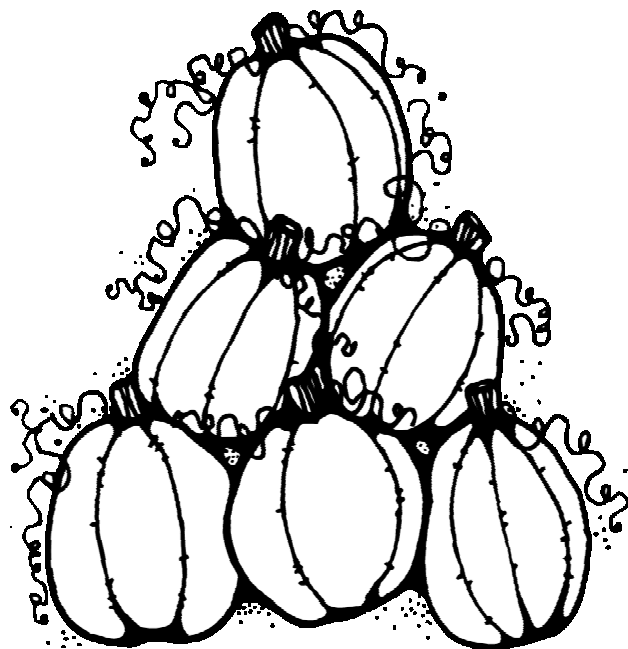
Pumpkins, pumpkins
